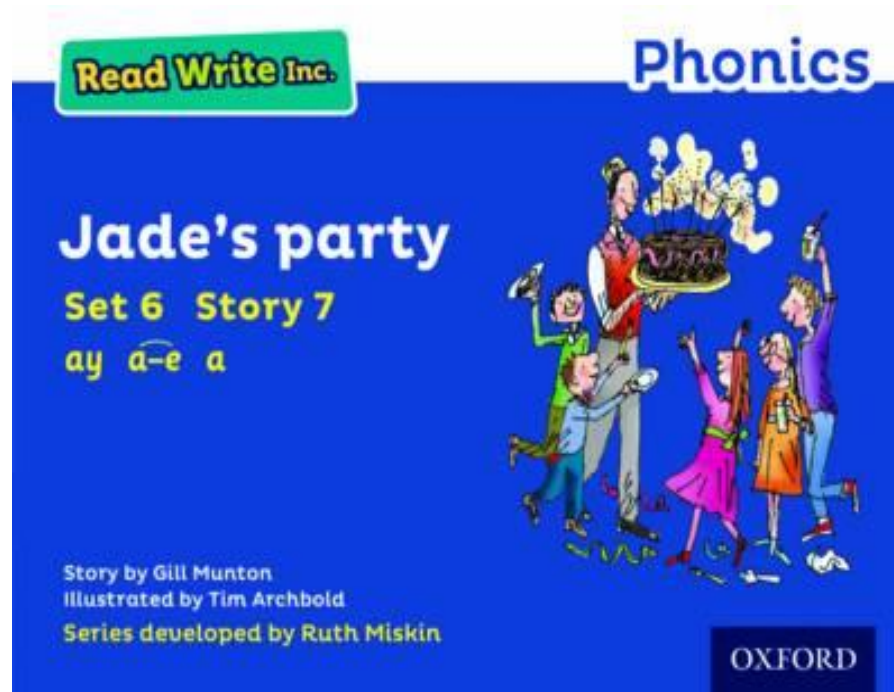

Speed Sounds

Consonants Ask children to say the sounds.

Each box contains one sound but sometimes more than one grapheme.
Focus graphemes for this story are **circled**.

Vowels Ask children to say the sounds in and out of order.

Story Green Words

Ask children to read the words first in Fred Talk and then say the word.

Jade cake group stale pale blame shame

Ask children to say the syllables and then read the whole word.

choc|o|late lem|o|nade teen|a|ge trol|l|ey curr|a|nt be|h|ave
pav|e|ment fish|c|ake spark|l|ers mus|ic|*

Ask children to read the root first and then the whole word with the suffix.

shop → shopping plate → plates race → raced

* Challenge Words

Vocabulary Check

Discuss the meaning (as used in the story) after the children have read each word.

group
raced
stale

definition:

a pop group

walked really quickly

food that isn't fresh

past the sell-by date
sparklers

food that is stale

metal sticks with special material
that lights up and sparkles when lit

sentence:

... we got a good one by a new group.

We raced along to the bus stop.

Out of the bag came a packet of stale
fishcakes ...

(past the sell-by date).

I had a chocolate cake with seven
sparklers on it.

Red Words

Ask children to practise reading the words across the rows, down the columns and in and out of order clearly and quickly.

Jade's party



My name is Jade.
It was my birthday on Sunday,

Dad made a shopping list.



twenty bread rolls
three packets of cheese
ten bags of crisps
ten milk shakes
ten cans of lemonade
a packet of napkins and a packet of plates
a packet of balloons
a CD of party music
a big chocolate cake



Dave's my teenage brother.
Dad asked him to take me to
the shops on the bus to get all
the stuff for the party.

We got a trolley, and Dave looked
at the list.

First, we went to the place where they bake bread.
Dave picked up twenty rolls and put them in the trolley.
(I picked up a currant bun, and hid it under the rolls.)

Then I found the cheese.
(Dave found the currant bun,
and told me to behave.)

Crisps ...
milk shakes ...
lemonade ...

The trolley was filling up.



Party napkins, plates and a big packet of balloons.
Dave said he'd blow them up.

A CD – we got a good one by a new group.

And then the most important thing:
a chocolate cake (the biggest, with 'Happy Birthday' on top).

We went to the checkout to pay. A girl put all the
stuff in plastic bags and gave them to Dave.

Then we raced along the pavement to the bus stop.
We made up party games on the way.



Dad started to unpack the shopping.
Out came ... a packet of stale fishcakes
(past the sell-by date) ...
shampoo ... a cabbage ...
a can of hair spray ... a bunch of grapes ...
a jar of marmalade ... and a jumbo pack of nappies!

Dad's face went pale.

"For goodness' sake, Dave!" he said. "What have you got to say?"

Dave said, "We must have picked up the wrong shopping by mistake.

Plastic bags all look the same to me. I'll take the blame, Dad.

I'll take it all back to the shops on Monday."



Well, it was a bit of a shame.

I hate grapes, and we didn't need hair spray – or nappies!

But it was okay in the end.



We had the party at a pizza place instead.

We had pizza, and chips, and pop.

Then, out came a man with a
birthday cake!

A chocolate one, with seven sparklers
on it. For me!



Questions to talk about

Ask children to TTYP each question using 'Fastest finger' (FF) or 'Have a think' (HaT).

- p.9** (FF) How did Jade celebrate her birthday on Sunday?
- p.10** (HaT) What do you think is the most important thing on the list?
- p.11** (FF) What did they pick up first?
(HaT) Why did Jade hide the currant bun?
- p.12** (FF) What did Dave say when he found the currant bun?
- p.13** (FF) Who put all the stuff into plastic bags?
- p.14** (HaT) Why did Dad's face turn pale when he started to unpack the shopping?
- p.15** (FF) Where did they have the party instead?

2. Who took Jade shopping?
3. Why did Jade and Dave race along the pavement to the bus stop?
4. Why was Dad cross?
5. Why was it OK at the end?
